# Meeting Of Student Voice

The meeting was called to order by President Jeanne Pedersen. All members were present except John Larson and Don Cooper. Mr. Larson read the following article from the Hayward High School Student Handbook: "Student Council: The purpose of the Student Council is to promote and to give experience in leadership, to correlate student activities, and to act in any capacity where the stu-dent body as a whole must be represented. It serves as an intermediary with the school administration, is a means of reflecting student opinion, and gives the student some measure of determination in matters delegated to them by school authorities. Any student who is a member in good standing of his class (at least a "C" in each subject) may be a candidate for representative. Two members are elected annually from the

Freshman. Sophomore, and Junior classes, three from the Senior class. One or more of the Seniors must have had previous experience on the Council. The Student Council can be effective only if each student takes an active interest in the selection of representatives and in the projects of the organization. Students should vote for members who have the time to spend and who are interested in the welfare of the entire school. But individual responsibility does not end there. Students should make their opinions known and be willing to help with the activities. Council meetings are open to all students and anyone who wishes to speak at a meeting may ask to be put on the agenda."

# Athletes Speak **Out On Athletic** Code At LHS

Is it right to separate the jocks from the rest of the people by making them abide by a code? For me, it's hard to believe that side burns or hair (if kept out of the way) could make a difference in our athletic performance. Is it right to let the coaches and principal make a code without letting the athletes have a thing to say about it? It is my opinion that they want us to look like they and their generation do. They try to run this thing when they don't take the changing styles into consideration. If it is unconstitutional to have a dress code. I think it should be unconstitutional to have this kind of code too.

The following questions were answered by our athletic Director.

Question: First of all, why did you feel we needed a code?

Answer: The code is to set a quide line for the coaches and the athletes. The code also sets rules on the athletes behavior.

**Question:** What is the arpose of the dating purpose rules?

Answer: Dating rules are set up to help keep the students' interests in sports. The coaches feel that excessive dating takes the athlete's mind off his playing.

Question: According to the code, swearing and anger is not allowed, what is the reasoning behind this?

Answer: Pretaining to Locker Room behavior, the student should try to control his temper for the simple reason that anger gains nothing.

Question: What is ment by a loss of privileges during periods of suspen-

Answer: According to training rules, an athlete may lose all privileges and awards during periods of suspension. If the penalties are severe enough, an athlete may lose all credit that he had gained that year, before he violated these training rules.

These same questions were then asked, and answered by our athletes, in the same order.

Answer - Question 1: According to a few of the athletes, there is a general

feeling among the sports participants that the code accomplished nothing but just said on paper what the coaches have already told them.

Answer - Question 2: The Athletes view on dating is basically the same as the code's rules. There is general agreement that excessive dating could prove to be harmful to the athletes.

Answer - Question 3: The view of swearing and anger in the Locker Room is regarded by the athletes as harmless if not used excessively. They feel excessive anger would make them cause more mistakes and maybe harm

the team's efforts.

Answer - Question 4: Most athletes felt that the loss of credit during periods of suspension was totally unfair. They felt that the credit that the athlete had gained should not be taken away. They also felt that the athlete's classwork shouldn't be a factor in determing a students sports participation.
