Friday, February 25th, Luck took on their old rival Frederic for the sub-regional championship. With hot-shooting from Duane Murphy, Luck took an early lead and kept it for the rest of the game. This sent Luck to the regionals to play Osceola.

One week later, March

3rd, the Cards took on the always-tough Chieftains. Taking advantage of Osceola's mistakes the Cards increased their early lead and started to stall and won the game by a margin of two points.

In the regional championship on Saturday, Luck met the defending champion - Clear Lake. This was a hard-fought game by both teams. Luck trailed most of the game but took the lead just before half-time and just into the fourth quarter. Unfortunately Clear Lake won 69 to 60.

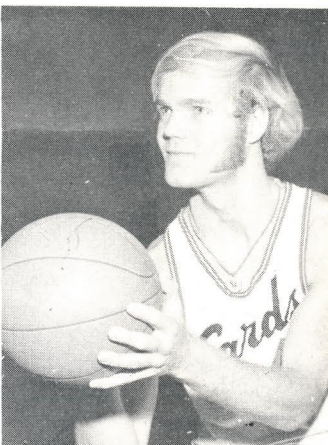

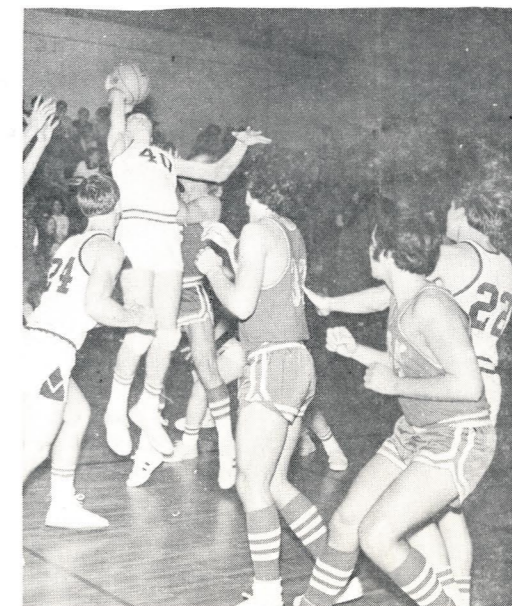
